Notice of Intention to make an Order

The Council of the District of Rother, in exercise of its powers under Section 21 of the **Town Police Clauses Act 1847**, as amended by Section 28 of the East Sussex Act 1981 and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with, or with the consent of, as may be required by statute, the County Council of East Sussex and the Chief Officer of Police, **will be making the following Order:**-

- 1. For the purposes of facilitating the holding of the Queens Jubilee Street Party in The Street between Dallington Church of England Primary School and Prinkle Lane Junction in Dallington and more particularly shown on the plan attached shall be closed between 11.30 and 13.30 on 27/05/2022 as provided by the above mentioned provisions subject to the terms and other conditions set out in the Schedule to this Order.
- Nothing in this Order shall prevent a Police Officer from suspending for any period the provisions of this Order in respect of any highway closed by virtue of this Order or prohibit any act done at the discretion or with the consent of a Police Officer.
- 3. Should, in the opinion of the organisers of the event for which the highway is to be closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic under the provisions of this Order, it be no longer necessary for the highway to be so closed, or should the event be cancelled, then the provisions of this Order shall be suspended for the whole or part of the period for which the closure is provided for.
- 4. The making of this Order does not authorise or otherwise make lawful the obstruction of the highway nor shall it be interpreted as giving such authorisation.
- 5. This Order will be cited as "The District of Rother (Temporary Street Closure) The Street No.17 Order 2022.
- The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliamentary, as if this Order were an Act or Parliament.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. The organisers shall be responsible for any injury or damage to property or persons caused as a direct result of the activities and the organisers shall ensure that they obtain satisfactory indemnity insurance cover.
- The organisers are responsible for the erection and cost of physical barriers and signs
 to the approval of the Highways Authority, to prevent vehicular access to all roads to
 be closed which should be capable of being removed quickly to allow access for
 emergency vehicles. All signs to be removed at the end of the temporary closure.
- The organisers are responsible for clearing the highway of refuse immediately after conclusion of the event, and for any damage which may be adjacent to the Highway, including street furniture, during the entire period of preparation, event and clearingup operation.
- 4. Street fire hydrants must not be obstructed.
- The organisers and any stewards on duty on the day of the event must observe any directions which may be given by a uniformed police officer, fire officers or ambulance officer.
- 6. Stewards shall be provided by the organisers at all road junctions throughout the time of the closure. All official stewards shall be issued with a badge or armband to indicate that they have been appointed as a steward to ensure that they are easily recognisable by the Police and emergency services.
- 7. Reasonable pedestrian access being available at all times.
- 8. No assistance can be given by the Police or local authority in the removal of vehicles from the closed length of road during the preparation of the event.
- No claims will be entertained by the County Council (as Highway Authority), the District Council, the Parish or Town Council or any statutory undertaker in respect of any accident damage or injury sustained as a result of the event.
- 10. The organisers are responsible for notification to all those affected by the Order, especially those occupiers of properties fronting the roads in Schedule 1 of the Order, in writing 14 days prior to the event.
